Pets 3 - Cats

Spark! Activity

Pretend to lick your paws (hands), then rub then behind your ears, or drink water out of a bowl with your tongue. Children can guess what you are doing, and what you are. The children can copy you, and think of some more typical cat movements.

Learning Group Time

Let's talk! What is the difference between, and what is the same about, this cat and the lion? (Click for printable). Introduce categorizing house cats/wild cats center. (Click for printable)

Discovery Centers

- Cats connect the dots. (Click for printable)
- Center Categorizing photos of cats into domesticated cats and wild animals. Which ones could we keep as pets? How are they similar, and different? (Click for printable)
- Cats clip cards center. Print on card, cut out. Children clip correct set number with a clothes pin. (Printable)
- Small group one to one correspondence and number stories with cats and balls of yarn. (Click for printable)
- Striped play dough. Make 2 colors of play dough, layer them, and cut strips
- Cat masks, stick puppets or heads for paper bag puppets. Color and b/w. (Click for printable)
- Cats emergent reader what do we need to do for our pet cat? (Click for printable)
- Upper case alphabet letters use to make recognition and matching games, bulletin board etc. (Click for printable)
- Cat photo 6-piece puzzle. Print 2 copies, cut up one and match to the other. (Click for printable)
- Story starter coloring page: "Cats need to visit the vet because..." (Click for printable)
- Printable Cats like to play with small toys. Draw some toys for these cats. (Click for printable)
- Connect cats and food bowls by tracing the lines. (Click for printable)
- Center cats order by size. (Click for printable)

Creative Art

- Design a cat toy with yarn and pipe cleaners, plus crumpled paper and tape. Pull it around and have the other children/kitties chase it.
- Make a kitty headband tape 2 pointed ears onto paper strip. Children decorate with art materials.

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










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






Cats clip cards center. Print on card, cut out. Children clip correct set number with a clothes pin.



















Trace the lines and make sure these kitties have some dinner.










Set of upper case letters to make games, and for bulletin board and pocket charts.. Print 2 copies for matching and memory games.






















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
